Who is God?

A recap of Intercultural Neighbouring Sunday, 21st July 2024.

- ♦ God is our Creator, and we are all made in God's image. (Genesis 1-2)
- God is intent on blessing all the nations of the earth. (Genesis 22:17-19.
- God is the One who brings salvation to the ends of the earth. (Isaiah 52:10)
- God is the One who has acted throughout history to make Israel a light to all nations.
- God is the One who works in surprising ways through surprising people like Rahab the prostitute, who lived in Jericho and Ruth, another foreigner. Both women feature in Matthew's genealogy of Jesus Christ. (Joshua, Ruth, Matthew 1)
- God is the One who sent Jonah to the foreign city of Ninevah and patiently put up with Jonah's stubbornness and sulky moods. (Jonah)
- God is Jesus Christ and God was pleased to fully dwell within him.
 (Colossians 1:19)
- ♦ God is Jesus, who was full of praise for a woman from outside of Israel who gave him a clever, snappy answer. (The Syrophoenician woman who knew she was entitled to Jesus' grace and healing)
- ♦ God is the One who unites all of us, as unique individuals, through and in Jesus Christ. (Galatians 3:28)
- ♦ God is Spirit. (John 4:24)
- God is the One who in Jesus Christ ate with sinners, allowed women to sit at his feet as disciples, dared to touch those regarded as unclean, was moved by compassion, who wept, who laughed, who feasted and who ventured beyond the limits of his own cultural identity and traditions.
- God is good. (everywhere throughout the Bible God's goodness is proclaimed and praised, in the Psalms)
- ♦ God is love. (1 John 4:16)
