# **Ladies Bible Study**



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## Bread of Heaven, Feed me. - John 6:24-35

In today's reading from John's Gospel, Jesus had gone across the lake from where he had fed 5000. On his return Jesus appears to his disciples walking on water. Now the crowds once again catch up with him at Capernaum. Jesus challenges them all. John 6:26 "you are looking for me because you ate bread and had all you wanted."

Having travelled across the lake and back again, it would have been pretty natural for the crowd to be hungry again. They had already been fed by Jesus so it was reasonable for them to ask him for more food.

Jesus, however, is willing and able to give them something far more satisfying and much longer lasting than mere bread. Only the bread of life will satisfy their inner most craving. Still today, the church sustains the physical needs of thousands of people through a range of practical services, but our supreme offering to the world is actually Jesus Christ, the Bread of Life.

While it is very important to keep people alive – hence the works of the church in support of the needy, it is much more crucial that we, and they, are spiritually alive. Have you done the one work that Jesus says really counts? "Believe in the one God sent?"

Belief in Christ is new every morning. He proves his love for us over and over again as we depend on him. Verse 32 "it is not Moses who has given you the bread from Heaven, but it is my Father who gives you the true bread from heaven." At the last supper, a normal Passover meal was eaten yet the gospel writers only record the consumption of bread and wine. That meal was much more than merely satisfying the human hunger and thirst. This was a meal to nourish the life that never perishes. This sustained the spiritual life of his disciples.

The gospel writer is making it very clear that the Bread of Heaven is not "what" comes down but "He' who comes down from heaven. In the end the really substantial nourishment is not physical, as important as that is. Only Christ satisfies our deepest need for life.

So what was the crowd's response? Verse 34 "Sir, always give us this bread."

This is a wonderful response from the Galilean crowd that day. They had no theological training but they clearly understood what Jesus said.

Still today we offer the glorious response when we sing that great hymn "Bread of Heaven, feed me now and evermore."

Finally; let me finish with the words or Jesus himself as recorded in verse 35. "I am the Bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never go hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty."
