God's actions towards those God loves.

This Sunday we will give thanks for the way God acts in our lives. The prophet Zephaniah wrote the following passage describing the actions of God towards humankind. Try counting all the different ways that God acts in the reading.

¹⁴ Sing, Daughter Zion; shout aloud, Israel!

Be glad and rejoice with all your heart,

Daughter Jerusalem!

¹⁵ The Lord has taken away your punishment,

he has turned back your enemy.

The Lord, the King of Israel, is with you;

never again will you fear any harm.

¹⁷ The Lord your God is with you,

the Mighty Warrior who saves.

He will take great delight in you;

in his love he will no longer rebuke you,

but will rejoice over you with singing."

I will rescue the lame;

I will gather the exiles.

I will give them praise and honour

in every land where they have suffered shame.

²⁰ At that time I will gather you;

at that time I will bring you home.

I will give you honour and praise

among all the peoples of the earth

when I restore your fortunes

before your very eyes,"

says the Lord.

God's actions towards us are based in love. What do our actions look like if we also base all we do and say in love, including love for ourselves, love for others and love for this beautiful, created world and all living things?

Reflect on this reading as your pre worship homework. During our Family Breakfast Service we will respond to the Zephaniah reading with a Prayer of Confession.
